Dear Josephine Tucci, Sheri Doniger, Michelle Kapusta, Heidi Hedstrom, Mary Silber, Richard Sloan, Georgia Talaganis, and Pamela Stavinoga:

There is a book in the early literacy section of the Lincolnwood Library that we object to. It is called "The Hips on the Drag Queen Go Swish, Swish, Swish." The cover has an illustration of three drag queens, one who has a full beard and a moustache. It is colorful and attracts attention.

Drag queens are adult entertainment. They are hypersexualized caricatures of women that have no place in children's literature, and they don't present a female image that we are comfortable exposing our children to. Our kids are innocent on topics such as this, and we have decided, as parents, not to introduce this subject matter to them. It doesn't seem the least bit controversial to say that young children - those who browse the early literacy section- would have a hard time processing the reality of men dressing like women.

They won't and should not understand why hips should go 'swish, swish' and it's certainly not something we want our children to emulate.

We have no issues with drag queens. Everyone has a right to self-expression.

We have issues with people who want to expose our children to adult topics before they are emotionally or intellectually mature enough to understand them. Children in the community will see these images of men dressed like women and read the words 'drag queen.' This may start conversations about these topics long before parents intend to have them.

We've been told by fellow community members that the library director feels that displaying books like this is a matter of representation and inclusion. She has also said that no one has to take this book home. This inappropriate content is on the cover of the book. There is no way to let children browse in the early literacy section and have them NOT be exposed to these topics.

We firmly agree that all members of our community should be represented and included. To us, this is not an issue of inclusion or representation. This is an issue of appropriateness and who gets to decide when and how our children get exposed to adult topics. The Lincolnwood Library does not get to decide when and how our children learn about hypersexualized individuals and drag queens.

Your Core Values state that the Lincolnwood Library values a welcoming environment for all members of the community. Lincolnwood is very diverse in its ethnic, cultural, and religious make-up, and this book displayed front and center at the library and read at story hour (without forewarning) at our parks does not reflect the values of community members from these diverse backgrounds.

We are finding it difficult to feel that our families are represented or included at the Lincolnwood Library. Decisions like this increasingly make us feel that our kids are more and more likely to be exposed to adult themes while browsing early reader books at their local library. We are finding it increasingly hard to trust the Lincolnwood Library to have our families' best interest at heart. We are imploring you to consider all residents of this town when you are choosing materials and media for the library and regulating access to these materials. Finally, we are challenging you to ACTUALLY be inclusive of all neighbors and taxpayers.
